To welcome the sun shine season, students of KG welcomed Basant Panchami by making yellow flowers using a fork.






Parent Appreciation Day


Graduation Day
























Language Policy - JAM - My Favourite Toy

Children listened to the story of 'The Lion and the Rabbit', and with the help of their imagination drew their favourite character with 2D shapes.






Drawing - My Best Friend: Together we play Together we dance Together we laugh Together we cry That's what makes you the best friend of mine.

Changes with Shape:

As a part of their ongoing theme – Changes - students learnt about various changes in shape. They explored that two triangles if joined together can make a Rhombus, two rectangles joined together can make a square. Any chances of two semi-circles?







House with 3D shapes:

Architects in the making...students of KG enjoyed designing a house of their own using 3 D shapes learnt.



2D Shaped Drawings: This was the morning when all the shapes came together to make something interesting! A pink hut with a chimney or may be triangular mountains, a curvy river or circular flowers.







3D Shape - Cone:

Happy birthday party...did we make a cone shaped cap? Yes, we did! Students learnt the 3 D shape in a fun-filled manner. Later, they reflected on their surroundings by finding cone shaped objects in the art file.



Recapitulating Number Names:

Writing Number Names was fun for our children when they wrote Number Names according to their parent's phone numbers. What a fun way to recapitulate the concept learnt.





Science Experiments:

Young minds are curious about pretty much everything ... just like scientists! This is the perfect time to start doing hands-on science projects and experiments. Children love to try things out and learn how the world works, which is exactly what these science activities give them a chance to do. Students of KG demonstrated a Science Experiment on their own and explained the same to the class.





Changes –

Changes is the Theme of the Month - in keeping with that children observed how water changes to ice and ice back to water - an example of Temporary Change. In addition, they learned the properties of water - no shape, no colour. Also they prepared curd from milk - an example of Permanent Change.



Weather Díal Students learnt about the difference between weather and season. How does a change in weather affect our daily lives? Later, with help, they made a weather dial to keep a check on daily changes.





Traffic Signs - Dress & Tell




Day 2: - was dedicated for "Yoga Practices" where kids learned various exercises which helped them to learn about correct sitting and standing postures.

It helped them to build their self-confidence and self-esteem. It enabled them to improve their descriptive skills by communicating feelings, thoughts and emotions with words. The students were informed to speak about their favourite mode of transport. They were excited to share their descriptive narration and waited eagerly for their turn to show and tell. Thus, this event helped our tiny tots to build their social, emotional and language skills. The inspiring presentation left no stone unturned to achieve a realistic appraisal of their skills and to discover the power of spoken words.






The way I wanted the story to be.....

Stories play a vital role in the growth and development of children. The books they read and the characters they get to know can become like friends. It's also good for children to understand that books are a useful source of information and that good reading skills are important for success in their future lives. Reading also helps children with their confidence levels, coping with feelings and language and learning. Children who can read well are more likely to have higher confidence levels. Stories are a great way to introduce new words and ideas into a child's language. Stories help to develop a child's imagination by introducing new ideas into their world – ideas about fantastical worlds, other planets, different points in time and invented characters. When children read stories that contain feelings it can help them understand and accept their own feelings. It helps them understand that there are other children who feel the same way and they are not alone.

So the students of grade II expressed their feelings and narrated stories of their choice, in their own ways.









Learning Capacity:

Students learnt the concept of capacity by filling water in containers of different sizes to compare and understand the capacity of each container.








Grade IV



Mathematics:




English

This communication activity was conducted in Grade 4 in the month of March. The students first chose one emotion such as love, anger, happiness, sorrow, fear, anxiety etc. Then they made an emoji placard related to the emotion. After that they wrote two synonyms for the emotion (Eg : Happy : joyful , gleeful) The student then related that emotion to a personal incident or a story. While they narrated the incident/story, which features that emotion/emotions they showed the placard, when that emotion was exhibited in the story. This activity stimulated the ability of the students to express thoughts, facts and opinions orally. They were able to demonstrate critical thinking, acting skills and innovative thinking.







Grade IV

SST

Students of grade IV studied about Our Government in Social Studies. They read about Fundamental Rights, which comes along with fundamental duties and directive principles. Students framed fundamental duties for the students in schools. They did power point presentations of the same and came up with some interesting duties for students, which will make them responsible citizens of the country.





Geometry Activity - Angle sum property of a

triangle

An activity was conducted in class in order to explain the angle sum property in a triangle.

The students actively participated whereby they understood just by taking cutouts of three corners of a triangle and placing them on a straight line how its sum is equal to 180°. Students were able to calculate the sum of the interior angles of the given triangle. They were able to calculate the third interior angle of a triangle if the other two interior angles are known. They can further apply this knowledge in real life situations.







Grade VII

Math

Students of grade 7 demonstrated one of the most important property i.e. When two lines intersect each other then a pair of vertically opposite angles are equal by cutting pasting method. It was easier for them to apply the same whenever needed in solving the exercise sums.





Learning Sanskrit:

Students of **grade VI** chanted the Sanskrit shloks flawlessly which depicted their language proficiency.



Students of grade VII dramatized the importance of yoga in life. They depicted the art of living through their language proficiency.





Students of **grade VIII** chanted the Sanskrit shloks with expressions and understanding. They taught us the true meaning of a beautiful life. They also shared information about the most ideal destinations of fun and frolic, Goa in Sanskrit.
