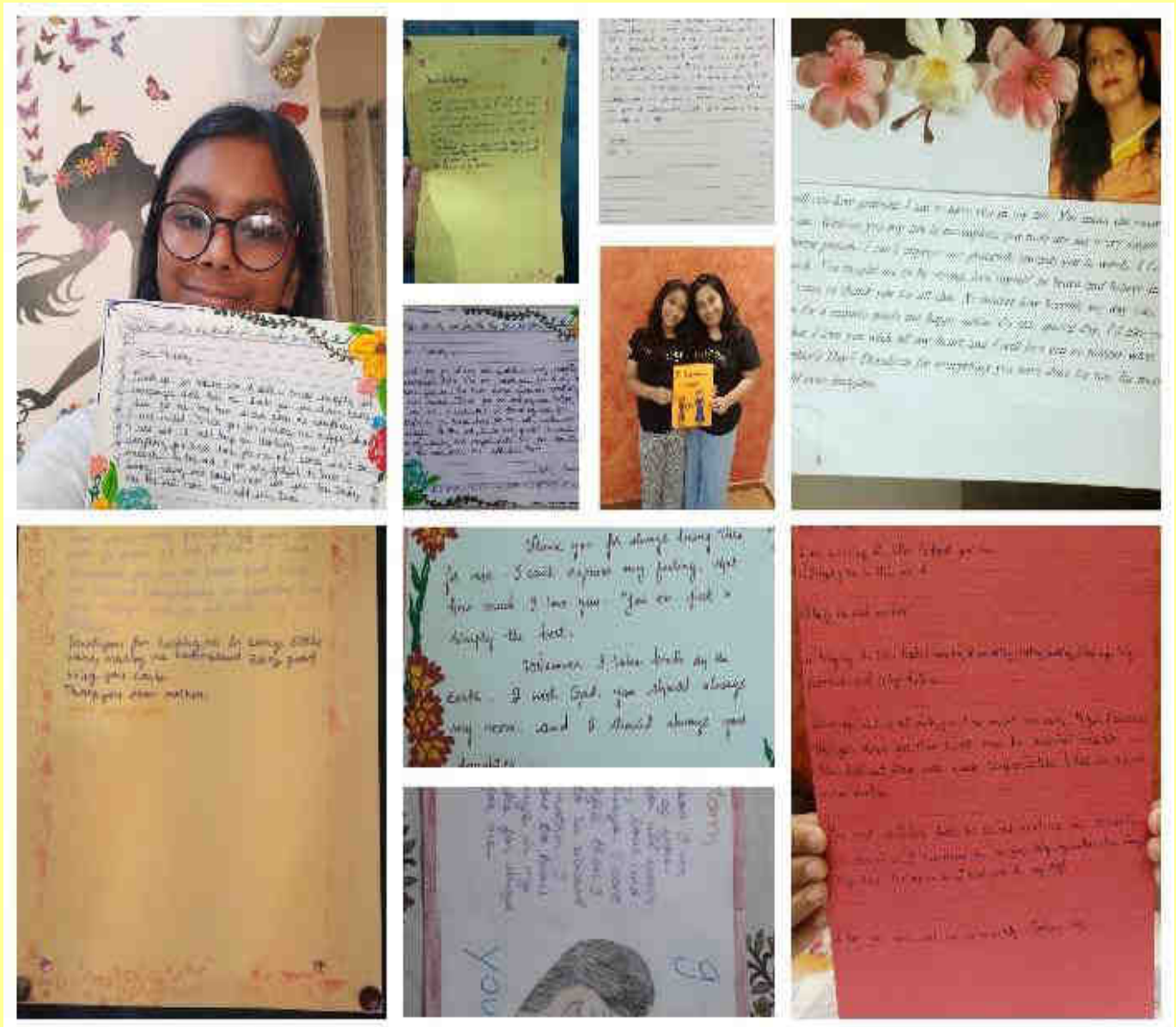

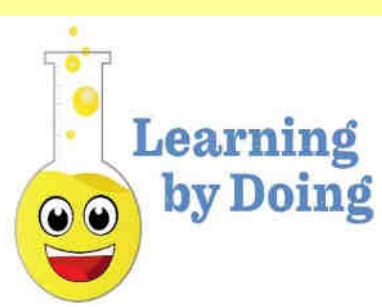
Shape_Me

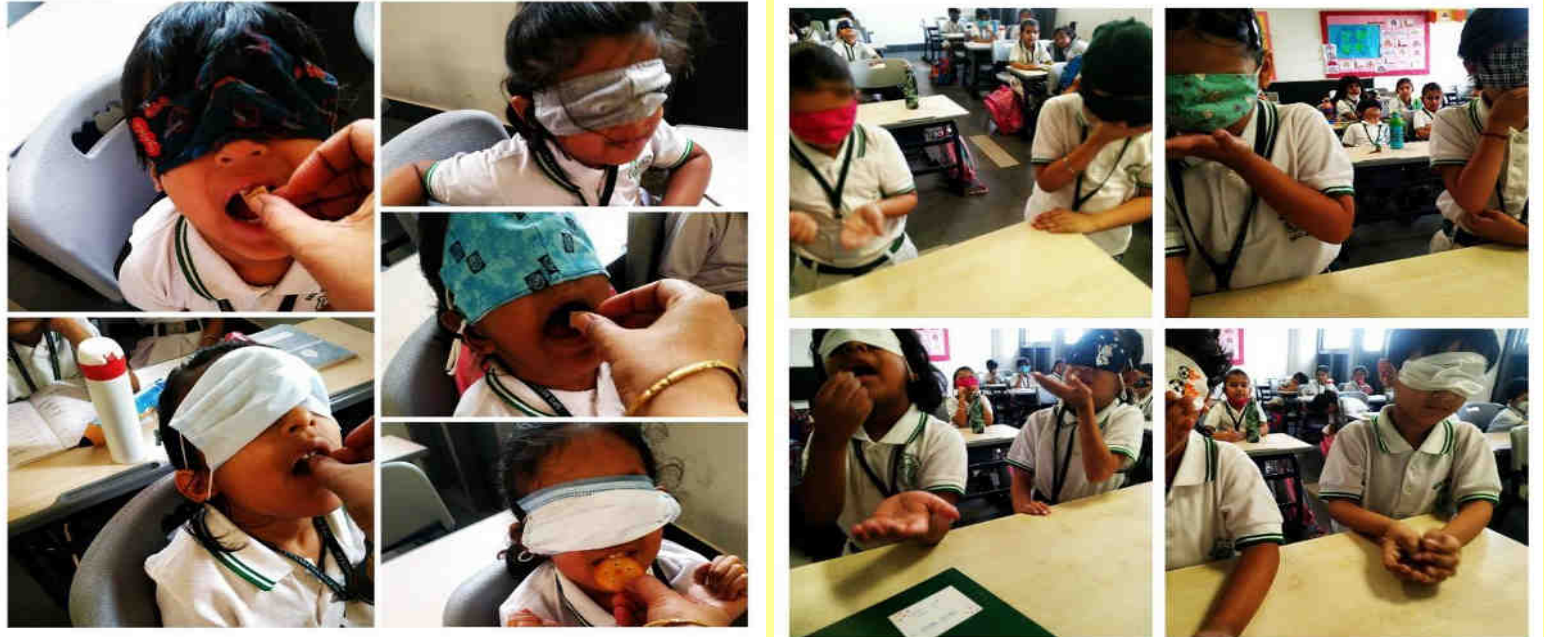

Mathematics:

Counting is important because the meaning attached to counting is the key conceptual idea on which all other number concepts are based. Grade II students learnt to count two-digit numbers and three-digit numbers with the help of number flash cards. Learning by doing being one of the most effective way of learning, the concept of identifying the types of sentences was taken up for the topic – “Types of Sentences”. The **Grade –V** students were made to write meaningful sentences of their own on a piece of paper and thereafter paste them under the appropriate column on the board as per their own understanding. The class board was prepared by the facilitator where she mentioned the types of statements.

This activity helped them to identify and differentiate interrogative, affirmative and negative sentences. They also learnt to frame grammatically correct sentences.

English:

In today's virtual world people have lost the knack of writing letters and also to express their thoughts and feelings with clarity. Students of **Grade-VI** were motivated to write a letter to the person who they think has inspired them. They read the letter in the class and shared their reasons of being inspired. Students weaved their thoughts and expressions in their self-composed write ups. This written expression was then taken up by respective students by speaking it with appropriate expressions.

Poetry illustrations allow one to create a personal interpretation of the work by exploring the different layers of rhythm, character, cadence, imagery and other poetic techniques. Students of **Grade VIII**, took part in an activity where they had to read a poem and interpret its meaning through their creative illustrations. They read the poems and chose one that best reflected their artistic style.

Students of **Grade IX** participated in a Debate based on the topic- 'Are paper books better than E-books'. This open discussion had students expressing their opinions on the importance of both printed books and E- books. Arguments based on practicality and sentimentality resurfaced time and again. Opposing arguments were put forward by both the teams. It allowed the students to structure and organise their thoughts and helped them to learn more about the topic through a friendly competition. The debate proved to an engaging, active and learner-centred activity.

Science

Healthy eating habits can be inculcated from a very tender age and to make this habit fun filled and enjoyable, students of **Grade-VI** of Delhi Public School Sector 84, organized a healthy 'Sprouts Salad Making Activity'. The excitement of our dipsites seemed to be super high as they were amazed to know that lentils / pulses are the seeds that can grow again into a plant. They learnt the stages of germination of seed as well.

Students created beautiful paintings of different states of India and explained it. Through this activity, students got to know about different types of paintings that are painted in different regions in India.





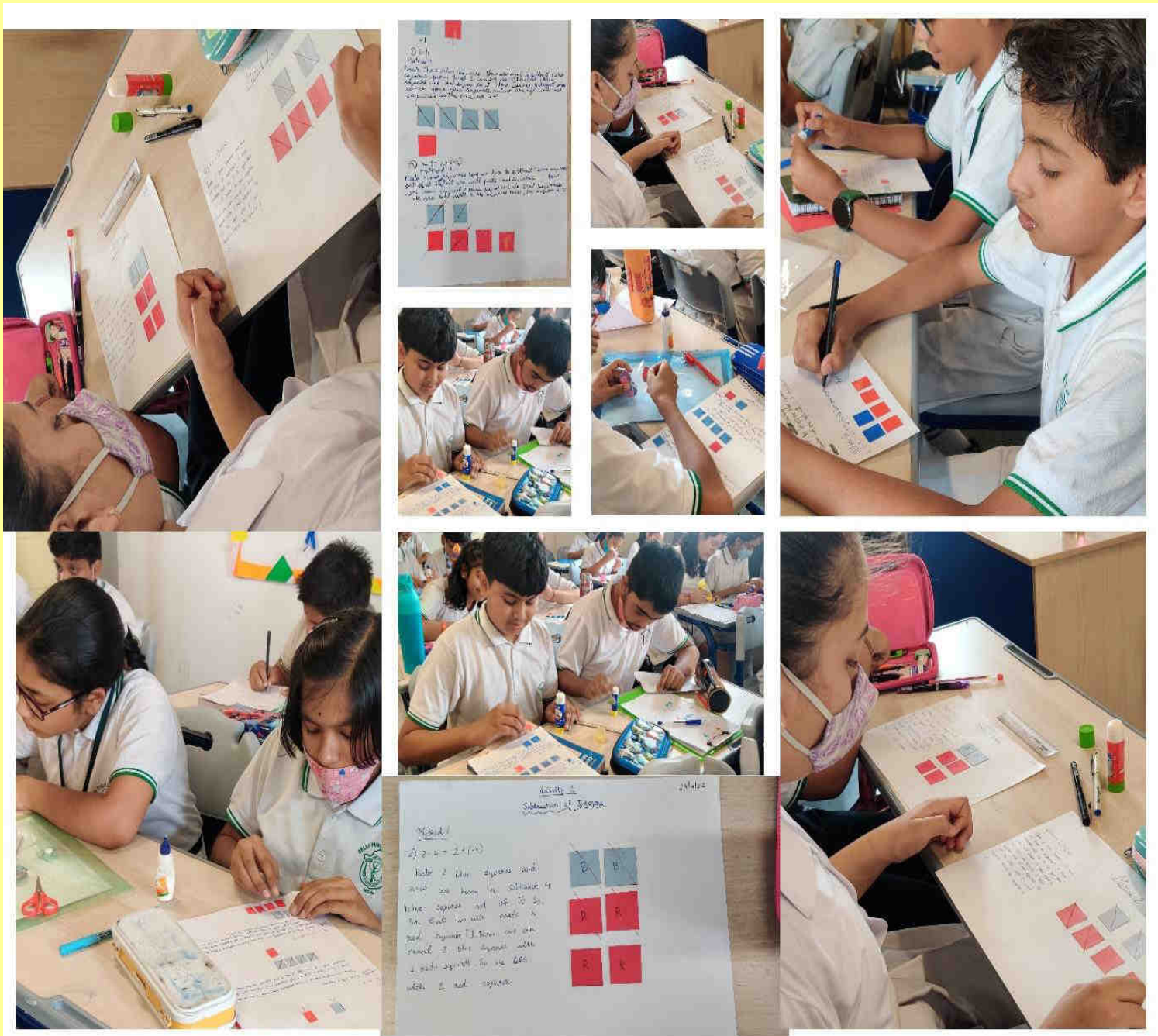

This unique collaborative experience was quite enriching for our students.

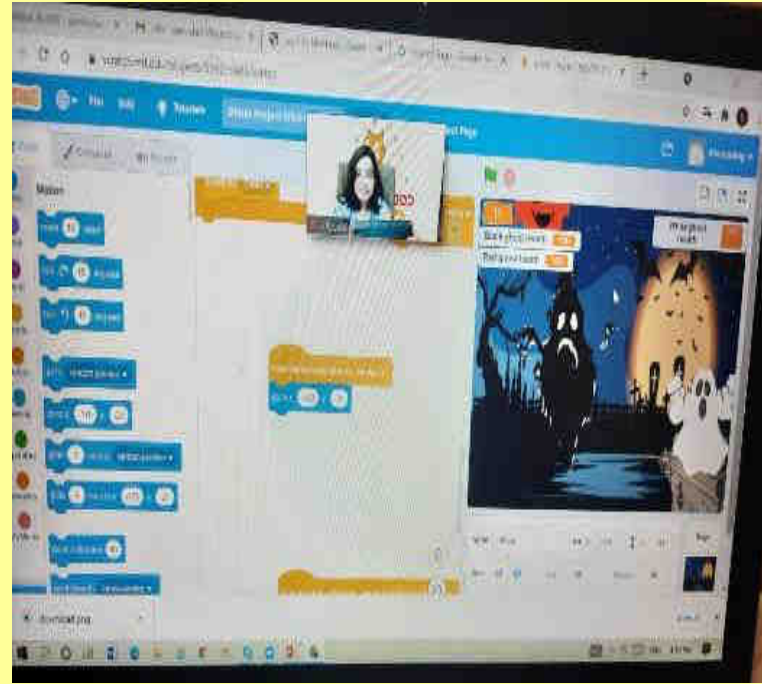
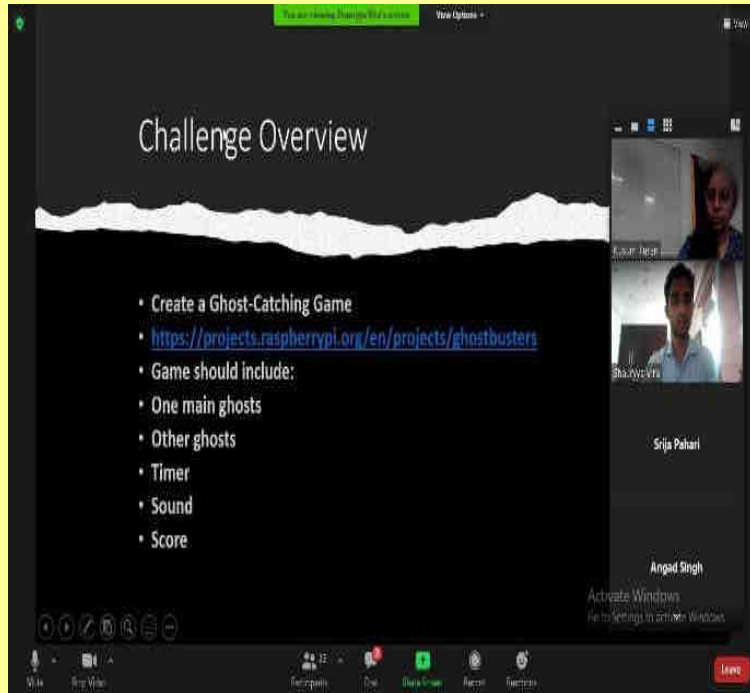

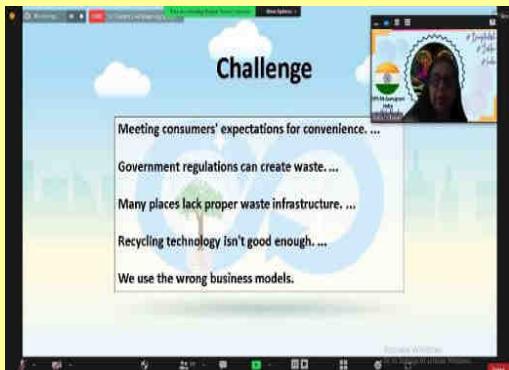
