GRADE I:



GRADE II:

Mathematics class was enjoyable for students of Grade II as the children learnt how to measure height through a very interesting and informative activity. 





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GRADE III :

Students of Grade III understood the importance of saving water and the problems related to water scarcity in the future with the help of a Show and Tell activity. They made posters and spoke about the conservation of water (3R's). They took a pledge of using water according to the need without wasting it.



GRADE IV:

Students of Grade IV were provided with an opportunity to put their knowledge of First Aid into action with the help of a role play. They learnt the basic treatment for common wounds and medical conditions, including cuts and scratches, fractures and sprains. They also made a First Aid kit for their class.





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GRADE V:

Incorporating life skills and values in our students has been the prime motto at DPS. Students of Grade V made thank you cards to express their gratitude for their parents, teachers and friends. During their Social Studies class children learnt about different deserts of the world through a map activity. Students also learnt the importance of First Aid in their Science class. They also discussed relatively simple techniques of First Aid that can be performed with rudimentary equipment's by a layperson until professional medical assistance arrives.







GRADE VI:

Students of Grade VI enjoyed their Science class as they were introduced to the idea that light travels in a straight line. They explored this fact through a model of Pin Hole camera. They observed an inverted image of a candle flame on the screen.





GRADE VII:

It is always our endeavor to help build on the speaking skills of children and to allow them to be able to think independently and express their thoughts. In continuation with the lesson, 'I Never Forget a Face', the class was divided into three groups of lawyers, policemen and citizens. Each group had to present their thoughts on why they thought crime rate was going up and what possible steps could be taken in their areas to bring it down. Interestingly, all three groups agreed that the police department was to be blamed due to their lack of dedication to their job.



With the value of the month being 'Gratitude', the children spent some time introspecting about the different things that they were thankful for. Usually we tend to take things for granted that come easily to us and through discussions, the children were made conscious of how they were privileged to have the life they took for granted. They wrote out 'I am Thankful For...' cards where they wrote out their thanks for things that they had in life.



GRADE VIII:

Students of Grade VIII did an activity on the topic 'Justice Delayed is Justice Denied'. They made posters and spoke about real cases, which included1984 Sikh riots, Aarushi murder case, Uphaar Cinema verdict and Jenerife Airport Disaster case.





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TECHNINJA'S

EDU DAYS: PROJECT SHOWCASE AND WORKSHOP

Alone we are smart, together we are brilliant

DPS Sector 84 participated in **Edu Days Event organized by Microsoft**. The objective of the event was to share Innovative teaching learning framework and expose the students and educators to state of art learning and innovation practices in education.

Our students and teachers worked for a Collaborative project "Mind Mapping: Rethink-Redesign-Reuse" along with five other school across India.

The objective of the Project was to sensitize our students about the current practices of using plastics and introduce them to circular practice of using plastics. The whole lesson plan was

designed keeping in mind **United Nations Sustainable Development Goals**. It made them to learn not to generate plastic waste but learn to consume or reuse as is seen in nature as well. It deepened awareness of the systemic challenges around plastic packaging and how these might be overcome through redesign.



During the execution of the project students from all the schools discussed on this topic through SKYPE. Students explored existing environmental issues concerning plastics and researched possible solutions and shared with each other.

Our students, Kritagya Tripathi, Devanshi Awasthi and Guneet Kaur of Grade VIII contributed to the project by developing a website that will help in taking up the issue to the community. The website also talks about various accessibility tools that can be used for inclusive education.

Kavish Devar of Grade V developed a creative animation through Scratch Programming depicting the concept of Linear and Circular practices of using plastics. The whole project was showcased in Edu Days event where around 20 teams participated and showcased their projects under different themes and categories. We stood **first** in the Strategize category.

HOUR OF CODE 2018

Students of Grade VI TO VIII participated in Hour of code 2018. The Hour of Code started as one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to demystify "code", to show that anybody can learn the basics, and to broaden participation in the field of computer science. Students from around the globe participate in it. 


