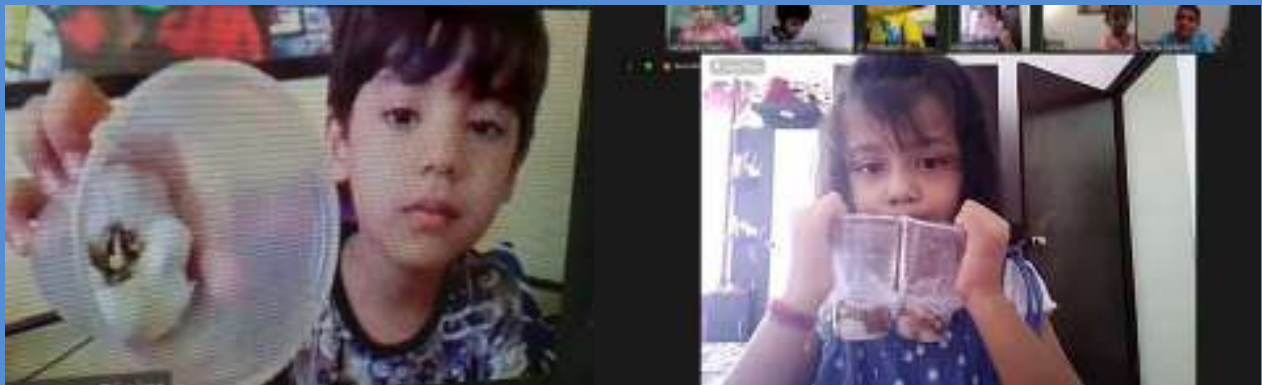
Parts of A Plant:

Plantation:

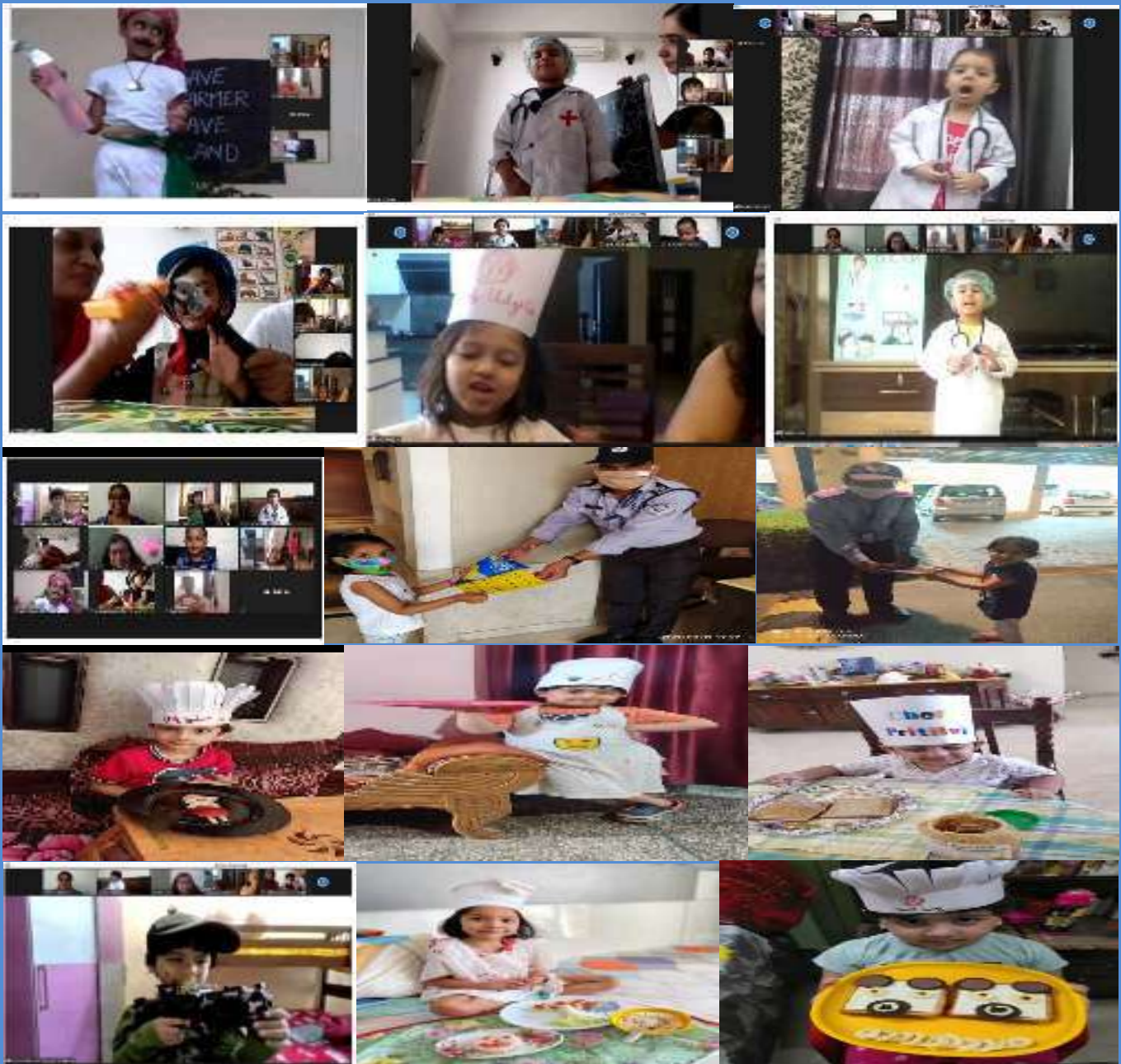
Plants are very important for our survival and these plants need sunlight, air, water and soil to grow. Our students learned about them in a practical way by performing an experiment.

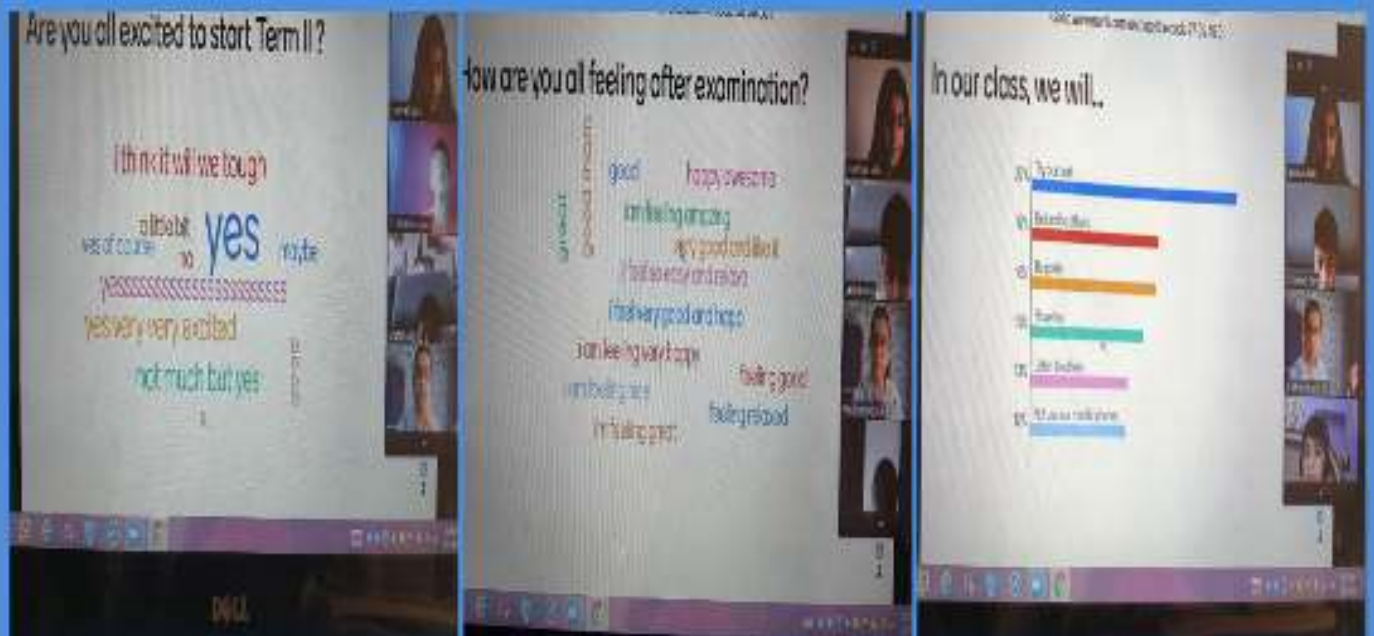
Experiential Learning

Grade-II EVS:

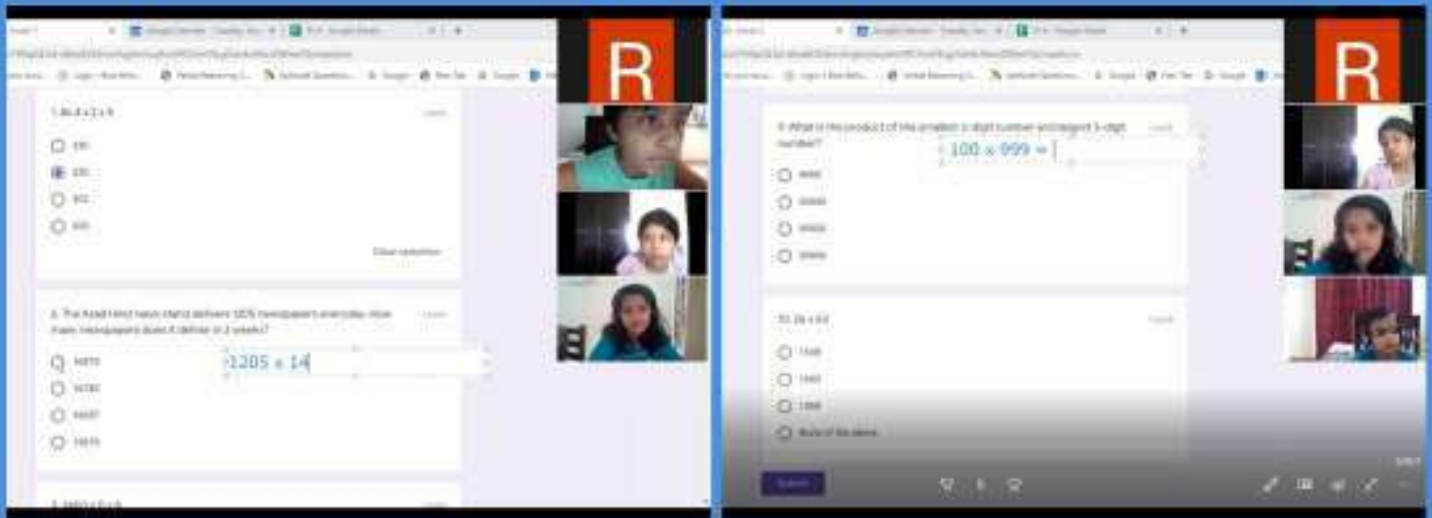

Grade III Math:

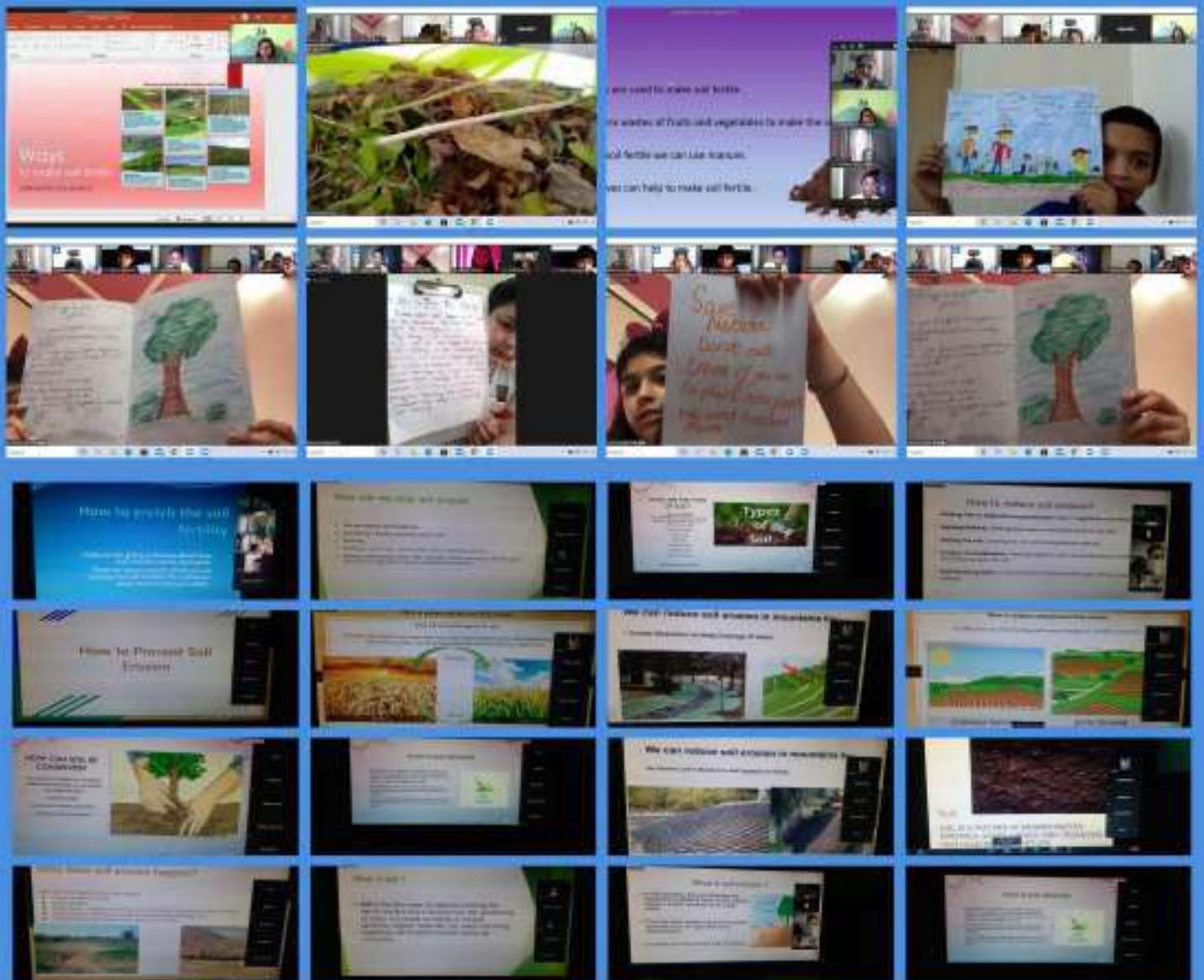

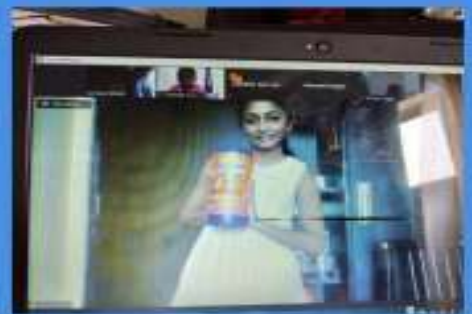

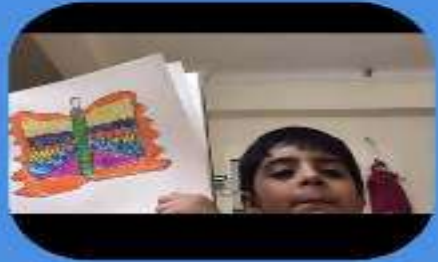
