
INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY STORE HARMONY & Ter


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Pre Nursery: Story Telling Session

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Pre Nursery: Interactive Learning Sessions

Early years ín children education are vital in terms of their social, physical, intellectual, creative, and emotional progress. These years lay the foundation for later school and success *development*. At DPS-84 our proposal focuses on creating a educational, fun, interactive that envíronment allows kids to learn while they play.





Pre Nursery: Show-N-Tell Activity

Show and tell (sometimes called show and share or sharing time) is the practice of showing something to an audience and describing it to them, usually a toy or other child-oriented item. The students from Pre-Nursery to class II participated in this activity which helped them to build their self-confidence and self-esteem. It enabled them to improve their descriptive skills by communicating feelings, thoughts and emotions with words.

On 25th of June, the students of Pre-Nursery had their Show-n-Tell activity on the topic-

"Me and My Neighbourhood" in which all the students showcased their talent and their inspiring presentation left no stone unturned to achieve a realistic appraisal of their skills and to discover the power of spoken words.

What could be more fun if a child identifies the shape with its properties on his/her own! I am sure, interesting! Our learners of Kindergarten walked on a rectangle to identify the various properties of a rectangle. They were able to tell the number of corners, sides and called it a 2D shape.



EVS

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What happens when students in a class have to be taught about the different professions that people have in a community? The students assumed the role of various community helpers, and started to understand from their teacher and parent the exact role of that helper, their tools, and how they are ultimately contributing to the community. Our students used STEM based activities to make their workshop.

English -We created an opportunity for our young readers to find their favourite books by taking small initiative steps such as **Making a word ladder-'at' words'**

A CVC word is made up of a Consonant-Vowel-Consonant sound.

Each letter has its sound and is therefore, decodable and easy for a beginner to sound out and read. Since CVC words are easily decodable, they help our readers feel accomplished when learning how to read.

With the help of this activity, our young readers could write these CVC words independently.

ENGLISH - BUILDING THE PRESENTATION SKILLS -




EVS: Paper Goggle Craft -

While our young learners of **Grade 1** learnt of ways to take care of eye and sight, they made a funky goggle out of paper and decorated as creatively as their little minds can wander.





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
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EVS: Pop goes the Corn-

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
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THE SUTBORES
