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


HINDI DIWAS

GRADES 1 & 2-



"Grandparents are like fairies or heroes. Their magical healing charm is hugs, and feel better pills are cookies."


Their stories build our childhood; their unconditional support makes us grow from strength to strength. These unsung heroes have grand ways of parenting, and also of being our playmates and friends.




















GANESH CHATURTHI








GRADE 3 -
